City Mall

Pedestrians share this area with the famous Christchurch tram. Big ticket stores, local artisans, the Riverside Market and the Bridge of Remembrance - feel the vibe of the city.

The Terrace

Lunches on balconies overlooking the river, evenings sipping cocktails and dancing the night away - it all happens on The Terrace. Includes terraced seating down to the Ōtākaro Avon River.

SALT District

The real Christchurch, the gritty back alleys, the hip laneways this is SALT. People in the know head to this area to hang out, eat, drink, and shop. Little High Eatery is a must for foodies.

The Arts

Refurbished stone buildings at The Arts Centre of Christchurch house slick modern stores. cinemas and exhibition spaces. For more art visit the Centre of Contemporary Art (CoCA) and the Christchurch Art Gallery Te Puna O Waiwhetū which boasts a significant national collection of modern art and the classics.







Rooftop Bars

We know we have the best scenic walks, top ice-cream spots, amazing beaches, the coolest little outdoor dining spots, and now we have rooftop bars which provide a new vantage point. Sit back, enjoy the sun, sip a local wine, and take in some spectacular views of our city and region.

Riverside

A 7-day-a-week farmers' market, hospitality hub and retail centre, Riverside is a gem in the CBD crown.

From small businesses stocking a single shelf, to the best local eateries slinging goods on the daily, a trip into town is not complete without time spent at Riverside.



New Regent Street

It won't take long to fall under New Regent Street's charm, designed in the Spanish Mission Revival style in 1930, it is now home to a range of small speciality shops, well-known cafés, bars and restaurants.

Discover the CBD

Take in the city's numerous CBD locations and attractions. Quake City tells the story of the 2011 earthquakes, while Oi Manawa Canterbury Earthauake National Memorial offers a place of reflection and remembrance. Margaret Mahy playaround is one of the country's best. Discover the natural history of Canterbury and the city's connection to Antarctica at the Canterbury Museum.

Port Hills

Dominating the city skyline, the Port Hills contain hundreds of walking and cycling tracks, native forest regeneration and the famous gondola. You'll also find the Christchurch Adventure Park, an epic destination for downhill mountain biking and NZ's longest zipline!

Hagley Park

One of the world's largest urban parks, Hagley Park is defined by open green spaces, the Botanic Gardens, and the Hagley Oval cricket ground. Wander among towering trees, marvel the roses, relax on the lawns. Peaceful and close to town.



Beaches and Coastlines

The city boasts multiple nearby beaches, the most famous being New Brighton and Sumner, both with established seaside suburbs. Explore further and discover Taylors Mistake, Waimairi Beach, and the entire coastline all the way north to Kaikōura.

Fancy a dip? Head to He Puna Taimoana in New Brighton for the city's best hot pools.

Banks Peninsula

One of NZ's most unique landforms, Banks Peninsula is a playground of scenic drives, remote bays, and quaint village vibes.





Explore Akaroa for a serene escape, Le Bons Bay for an epic beach and Okains Bay for topnotch camping.

Ötākaro Avon River

Why not take a punt or kayak along the Ōtākaro Avon River? Visit the Antigua Boat Sheds or head to one of the country's only central city kayak launch ramps, direct into the river. It's part of the Ōtākaro Avon Loop walkway on Oxford Terrace and makes it easier than ever to explore the river from water level.



Adventure

Ōtautahi Christchurch is one of the South Island's adventure capitals. Skydive over beaches, ride land yachts, climb across high-ropes courses and jump in a helicopter across the city.


Christchurch Adventure Park is a hot spot for fast action, with NZ's longest zipline and endless downhill tracks.

FIND A LAND OF WILDLIFE IN & AROUND OUR UNIQUE CANTERBURY COASTLINE.

Find magical places like nowhere else in the world – where rugged mountains meet the sea, and a unique ocean environment is home to an astounding variety of marine life.

Discover the storied history of Kaikōura and explore its many hidden gems. The deep trench that lies just off the coast, creates a year-round playground for a variety of marine life including sperm whales, dusky dolphins, New Zealand fur seals and albatross.

Explore the coast's culture in Kaikōura township, famous for its kaimoana (food of the sea) and its hospitality.

Find adventure on the Banks Peninsula, where you can meet the world's smallest dolphin, the Hector's dolphin, cruise in the shadow of craggy cliffs, and meander through the French-settled town of Akaroa. The Peninsula is home to more than 40 bays, many accessible through day walks and multiday hikes.

A GLOBAL SCENERY HOT SPOT -EXPLORE NEW ZEALAND'S HIGHEST MOUNTAIN, & LEGENDARY SCENERY.

Clearest starry skies, highest mountains, vivid turquoise lakes, expansive golden grasslands can be found in the legendary Mackenzie.

The Mackenzie district is the home of Aoraki/Mount Cook, Twizel and Lake Tekapo, this region is one of the most visited in all of New Zealand. Take a scenic flight into the mountains and land on glaciers; enjoy the night sky within the Aoraki Mackenzie International Dark Sky Reserve; explore the beautiful

landscape by cycling, walking, kayaking, swimming, skiing and more.

Experience the beauty of the countryside on the TranzAlpine train, starting in Christchurch it makes its way into the heart of the Southern Alps. Before heading into the Otira Tunnel and over to the West Coast, it stops in beautiful Arthur's Pass.

This is a landscape that stays in your memory forever – truly one of New Zealand's most cherished treasures.


Combine family-owned vineyards with an innovative approach to viticulture, and throw in close proximity to the second largest city in the country, and you've got the North Canterbury Wine Region.

O Hanmer Springs & North Canterbury Wine Region

Just north of Ōtautahi Christchurch city lies a land of wine and hot pools. Hanmer Springs is the alpine village retreat famous for its hot pools, mountain biking and tranquil surroundings. The North Canterbury Wine Region is a haven of familyowned vineyards, cellar doors accessible by bicycle, and boutique stays. You haven't experienced Canterbury until vou've been to these two epic destinations, within two hours of the city.

Kaikõura

Two and a half hours' drive from Ōtautahi Christchurch is Kaikōura, one of NZ's most beautiful towns, where the mountains meet the sea and deep-sea trenches create a playground for sperm whales, dusky dolphins, fur seals and albatross.

Activities galore happen on land and off shore, getting you up close with wildlife and the storied history of the region. Take some time to escape and explore.



Uncover an ancient volcano filled with sparkling colours and a diverse range of experiences with nature on the doorstep.

Surrounded by natural wonders is the historic town of Akaroa, formerly a French settlement, now a character-filled village with a vibrant dining and shopping scene all in an idyllic seaside setting, just over an hour drive from Christchurch.

Be sure to take in the view from the water on a harbour cruise, kayak, yacht or paddleboard.

O Arthur's Pass & Selwyn

Alpine adventure awaits those who traverse the scenic drive to Arthur's Pass.

Either by train or car, Arthur's Pass sits at the heart of the Southern Alps, between Canterbury and the West Coast, and serves as a hub for mountaineering and tramping in the area.

Tracks lead off the main road into the mountains, accessing ridgelines and waterfalls, forests and rocky outcrops.









Mackenzie

A jewel in the South Island crown; deservingly one of the most visited and photographed places in New Zealand.

Just a two and a half hours' drive from Christchurch, the region boasts the world's largest gold status international dark sky reserve, New Zealand's highest peak and largest glacier, and some of the most breath-taking scenery in the world.

Relax and unwind, take a scenic flight or adventure into the backcountry – the legendary Mackenzie has it all.

Waimakariri

The Waimakariri region is one of vast natural beauty, slower-paced country towns and desirable beach settlements – all within 20 minutes of Ōtautahi Christchurch city.

The region's town centres nestled in the heart of Rangiora, Kaiapoi, Oxford, Woodend and Pegasus have personality plus with many cultural and recreational offerings. Discover walking and cycling tracks, braided rivers, sandy beaches and bustling towns.

Mid Canterbury

Mid Canterbury offers an inspiring range of activities, complemented by genuine New Zealand hospitality.

Within an hour of Ōtautahi Christchurch you can ski, white-water raft, skydive. Or you may want to try archery, clay bird shooting or simply have a round of golf. One way to see it all is by a hot air balloon flight which provides you with a bird's eye view.

It's all here waiting at the heart of Te Waipounamu, our stunning South Island.

South Canterbury


A destination for families, foodies and adventure seekers, Timaru and South Canterbury are stacked with beautiful outdoor environments.

Orana Wildlife Park



Orana Wildlife Park, NZ's only open range zoo, provides amazing opportunities for people to connect with wildlife.

Visitors can see NZ's only gorillas, travel through the Lion Habitat, hand feed majestic giraffe, meet mighty rhino up close, observe kiwi and encounter mischievous kea. Scheduled daily presentations mean visitors can enjoy the antics of painted dogs, cheetah, Tasmanian devils, lace monitors, friendly farmyard creatures, monkeys, meerkats and more!

Visitors can board our Safari Shuttle for a tour of the zoo or join a guided walkabout to explore the Park. A café and wildlife themed giftshop are located on-site.

Orana is operated as a registered charity. Over 95% of our income is generated through visitation and staff separately raise 100% of funds for all developments, animal transfers and involvement in key conservation programmes. Park staff are privileged to be involved in breed for release programmes for threatened NZ native wildlife such as kiwi and kākāriki karaka/orange-fronted parakeet. Explore one of New Zealand's finest and most important collections of mature native and exotic trees and plants collected from all over the world. Wander through historic conservatories filled with tropical flora and floral displays. Set in a tranquil 21 hectare site, this wonderful peaceful environment is a must visit to walk through or sit and relax and enjoy the garden's beauty.


