International students in our region are valued and embraced for their cultural diversity, international perspective and lifelong friendships they bring.



High Tech Services

Christchurch has New Zealand's third largest tech sector and Canterbury is the nation's second largest advanced manufacturing centre. With an international reputation for producing the smartest service tech, Christchurch boasts a dynamic tech ecosystem offering excellent employment opportunities for graduates.

The Christchurch tech sector contributes \$2.4 billion worth of GDP and over 15,000 jobs to the local economy.

Aerospace and Future Transport

Due to its location, geography and clear airspace in combination with expertise in manufacturing, tech and engineering and a strong emergent community, Canterbury has a significant local advantage and capability in the Aerospace and Future Transport industries. New Zealand is one of only 11 launch capable nations, providing international businesses the opportunity to test their ideas here. Local businesses with strengths in bespoke manufacturing, engineering & technical services provide opportunities for graduates in this exciting trillion-dollar global sector.



Canterbury is New Zealand's largest agricultural region, contributing 19% to the national agricultural GDP. The region produces meat and dairy products, plant-based products, seafood and wine for both domestic and international consumers.

The agricultural sector supports 26,100 people employed in agriculture, fishing and forestry and a further 13,600 in agricultural production processing in the region. Christchurch is the logistical hub and provider of manufacturing, technology and professional services into the agricultural sector.



Health Tech and Resilient Communities

With the establishment of the central city health precinct creating a much closer connection between research, testing and commercialisation, Christchurch offers the opportunity to accelerate research into analytics and machine learning, virtual healthcare, bio-metrics, wearables and insurance tech.

Once you have an offer of place or letter of acceptance from your education provider, and you've paid the required fees, you can apply for your student visa.
