KAIKŌURA

Kaikōura has some of the country's most breathtaking scenery with a mix of stunning coastline, dramatic peninsula and some of the South Island's highest mountains.

Kaikōura is the most northern district in the Canterbury region located on the east coast of the South Island – a 2.5-hour drive north from Christchurch.

Kaikōura is known as the 'Maritime Serengeti' of New Zealand where the undersea canyon plunges to depths of over 1200m very close to shore, and attracts a wide range of wildlife all year round, including the Sperm Whale, the Kekeno (New Zealand Fur Seal), Dusky Dolphins & a wide range of bird species.

Kaikōura is a tourism destination with marine based operators, unique experiences, and historic attractions along with a mix of both relaxing and exhilarating land-based activities.

Crayfish is THE delicacy of the Kaikōura region and Kaikōura literally means "to eat Crayfish".

Kaikōura has a vision to achieve International Dark Sanctuary Status by early 2024. Filled with stars, celestial wonders, and a stunning clear Milky Way (Te Ikaroa) — Kaikōura celebrates the pristine dark sky of Kaikōura realising it is one of our hidden gems.















MACKENZIE

Located in the centre of the South Island, halfway between Christchurch and Queenstown, the Mackenzie Region is famous for its turquoise blue lakes, New Zealand's highest mountain (Aoraki/Mount Cook) and largest glacier (Tasman Glacier), pure night skies and International Dark Sky Reserve, and some of the world's most spectacular scenery.

The Māori name for the region is Te Manahuna which means "place of enlightenment, or place of energy" which describes this region so well. It is a place of natural beauty, relaxation and enjoyment, a place to escape the busyness of life and fill your cup in nature.

The region offers an incredible array of visitor experiences including natural walks, glacier activities, stargazing tours, hot pools, and luxury lodges to name just a few. Enjoy a few nights in Lake Tekapo, Aoraki/Mount Cook and Twizel – we look forward to welcoming you.
