




Canterbury has been outperforming the New Zealand economy since May this year.


New Zealand – Economic Growth



New Zealand - GDP (quarterly growth rates, qoq) Q2 2016 – Q2 2021 (in %) Source: Statistics NZ





Average composition of Christchurch retail spending during 2021















Main takeaways → Economic Activity

- ✓ Economic activity has been robust despite pandemic environment.
- ✓ Regional economic confidence in Canterbury has been net positive since Q4 2020.
- ✓ Retail spending bounced back strongly in 2021 (monetary stimulus has also helped in this).
- Businesses are better positioned to operate under restrictions (as seen during the August 2021 lockdown).
- ✓ Net exports in Canterbury remained strong despite COVID global supply chain issue.


Perfect storm for inflation

Ongoing disruptions to global supply chains. Pass on cost increases into prices of goods. Inflation in tradables and non-tradables. Strong increases in transport costs. High house construction costs. Supply-side cost pressures. High commodity prices. Constrained supply. Labour shortages. Low interest rates. Solid demand.

Main Takeaways → Inflation

 \checkmark Inflation has been growing rapidly.

✓ Solid demand and constrained supply has favoured inflation pressures.

✓ Inflation is rising all over the world, is not only a New Zealand issue.





- Unemployment rates have been constantly decreasing throughout 2021 all around New Zealand.
- ✓ Although Christchurch's unemployment rate is still higher than the New Zealand one, it has been decreasing throughout 2021.
- ✓ Services sectors have been expansive in Christchurch.
- There has been a significant upswing in employment and working age population in Christchurch.






Hikes of OCR

Main Takeaways → Interest Rates


- ✓ Interest rates will continue to increase next year.
- Depending on the economic environment, the RBNZ could hike the OCR more rapidly than expected.
- ✓ The increasing hikes will have a direct impact on mortgages rates (that went up even before the latest OCR hike).





Housing Affordability

Despite significant house price growth over the past year, Christchurch has retained its affordability profile compared to NZ overall.

Main Takeaways → Housing Market

- ✓ Buoyant housing market across New Zealand
- ✓ Significant house price growth
- ✓ Strong growth in number of building consents, especially in Christchurch
- Christchurch maintains a good reputation as an attractive place to live (availability of jobs, affordability of living, good lifestyle)

Looking Forward

- Tight labour market
 - Unemployment expected to continue to fall
 - \circ Risk of wage-price spiral with low unemployment
- Inflationary pressures
- Increase in value of residential mortgages and debt servicing costs
 → Squeeze of discretionary incomes → Lower spending
- Higher proportion of equity in owner occupied housing and land (currently at an all-time high at 80.3%) – Too many eggs in one basket?

- COVID-19

 Impacts on visitor economy and supply of skilled migrants (what will happen when the borders open?)
 Ongoing supply chain issues
